1. Executive Summary

During the period under review, significant progress was made on the first three objectives of the Chair and on the recently added fifth objective, i.e.: a) to reframe the debate on migration, development and human rights from a Southern or counter-hegemonic perspective; b) to promote a North-South/South-South dialogue and an alternative agenda on the issue; c) to develop strategic indicators for a necessary demystification of the field; and e) to envision alternatives leading to a virtuous relationship between development and migration, in which the public university plays a strategic role.

It includes 11 conferences and working meetings, 1 book and the preparation of a Handbook on Migration and Development on the Chair's position, involving some of the world's leading specialists in the field. It also includes 11 book chapters (including some handbooks) and 14 articles in peer-reviewed journals.

The report also includes 6 working papers for the university reform process and a multimedia programme entitled Voices for the Re-signification of the University.
